GWP-Med is looking for future possibilities of anchoring the initiative to further governance activities, in order to sustain the initiative's results until now. However, the initiative has run in parallel with the elaboration of the <u>Rmel River Basin</u> <u>Adaptation Plan</u> , in the framework of the Bewater Project by feeding key youth input into its preparation.


