Appropriate institutional and policy Frameworks for:

- Integrated action
- Effective cooperation

- Across the Nexus sectors
- Across segments and actors in spatial management domains in the S2S continuum
- Among all stakeholders

Objective 1.1: Develop / adapt appropriate governance structures

- > Coordination at all governance levels regional, transboundary, country, and local
- > A coordination mechanism at Mediterranean level
- Institutionalization of coordination mechanisms to achieve horizontal and vertical integration (among WEFE sectors and across governance levels)
- > Integration in spatial terms: in basins, aquifers, coastal zones and marine areas

Objective 1.2: Mainstreaming WEFE Nexus into policies and strategies

- Sectoral policies and strategies should consider and internalise a cross-sectoral approach
- > Harmonization across sectoral "chapters" of national strategies and plans
- > Use of integrated management approaches (IWRM, ICZM, etc.)
- Linkages with global policy goals (SDGs, Climate Mitigation / Adaptation planning, energy transition, circular economy, etc)

Goal 2: Efficient and effective planning, financing and implementation of management and technical solutions

 Fragile areas are key sites for application Objective 2.1: Shifting demo Nexus applications to mainstreamed implementation, through investments and market mechanisms

- Demos to assess feasibility, cost-efficiency and effectiveness under different contexts and conditions
- Promote awareness, gather support, learning opportunities and attract funding for upscaling
- > Conditions for sharing investment and operating costs among users
- Move towards a market creation to make solutions financially feasible and attractive

Objective 2.2: Increasing capacities and financing for planning and implementation of Nexus interventions

- > Necessary institutional and legal frameworks and processes for implementation
- > Prioritise public spending and mobilizing national sources of finance
- > Use existing cross-sectoral international funding sources (climate financing)
- Processes to identify/prioritise solutions and attract investment capital

Goal 3: Informed decision making based on enhanced science-based knowledge, engagement of capacitated stakeholders, and increased public awareness

- Bridge gaps at the science-policy interface
- Enable stakeholders' leadership, ownership and engagement
- $\circ~$ Build capacities
- Facilitate exchange of information, knowledge and experience
- Raise public awareness

Objective 3.1: Promoting scientific research on WEFE Nexus and S2S aspects

- Key for assisting policy development by defining concepts, describing contents and deepening on priority fields
- Engage Universities and encourage academic cooperation

Objective 3.2: Ensuring data availability, harmonisation and sharing across sectors and borders

- Modernise, standardise and harmonise monitoring systems and databases across the Nexus sectors
- Promote synergies for the application of new technologies for cost-efficient, advanced monitoring systems.

Objective 3.3: Developing capacities of stakeholders

- > Identify capacity building needs and prepare related strategies.
- > Organise capacity building and training programs.
- Promote sharing of Nexus-related knowledge, experience, and expertise among stakeholders to inform evidence-based decision-making and policy formulation.
- Build capacities to identify interventions, prepare proposals to access and manage funding

Objective 3.4: Raising awareness and improving understanding and stimulating stakeholder's engagement

- Develop and conduct awareness campaigns for targeted groups and on tailored made priority elements
- > Support engagement and decision-making roles of women and youth
- Disseminate successful cases
- **>** Establish regional Communities of Practice

Implementation and monitoring framework, and synergies

Types of financial means and capacities

- Advancing integrated options can be more cost-efficient compared to isolated solutions
- Incorporate a WEFE Nexus lens in available sectoral financial means build dedicated WEFE Nexus funding lines
- > Coordinate domestic, private and international financing
- Foster innovative funding schemes
- > Prioritise WEFE Nexus action in international developmental assistance
