Needs in water and sanitation

- Access to water is a basic human right[®]
- Most of the regions of the world exp Sub Saharan Africa – will likely meet the MDG target
- Uneven global water distribution: 768 m people with no access to improved water sources (11%)
- 240 m people to remain without access to water by 2050
- 2.5 bn lacking access to improved sanitation, 1bn still practicing open defecation
- 1.7 m people die annually
- needed \$190 bn each year by 2015- only 7.8 bn
 in 2010 (4%)
 in 2010 (4%)



Private sector involvemen

Challenges

- Close the investment gap
- Better management of the asset
- Improve financial viability of the utility
- Improve efficiency and quality of the service provided

- PPPs confused with privatisation
- Distrust
- Social and political difficulties
- Poor level of staff training
- Technical difficulties to reach some parts of towns (e.g. shanty towns)
- Overambitious investment plans and timetables
- Currency and political risks, immature local financial market
- No acceptance by the inhabitants



Proposal for an Int Centre on water and sanitation



- > No leading agency on water PPPs
- Need of a less ideological approach, and to normalize the perception of water PPPs
- > UN is a unique neutral forum for discussion
- > Need to clarify and rectify the concept of water PPPs
- Need to highlight success and failure cases and the reasons behind

Need for expectations to be more realistic



To identify and to share best practices among new national /regional models in water and sanitation PPPs by developing best practices guidelines on water and sanitation and translating them into international standards through a UN process.

Structure:

An international specialist centre with a cluster of countries, private sector representatives, IFIs and IOs

Next steps and timeline

Milestone	Timeline
First Int Conference on water and sanitation PPPs	21-22 Oct 2014
Launch of 3 project teams for the development of international standards on 3 selected areas	By November 2014
Establishment of the cluster	By December 2014



Outcome of the conference

The Centre should:

- a) Focus on the identification of international PPP best practices and the development of relevant guidance tools that contribute to the achievement of the prospective Sustainable Development Goals with a focus on efficient and affordable water and sanitation services.
- b) Address the lack of verifiable information, and facilitate the exchange of information and international PPP practices (both pros and cons) and develop international PPP standards;
- c) Be structured around a 'cluster' of members composed of Member States, International Financial Institutions, international and regional organizations, and representatives of the private sector and civil society;
- d) Initially be hosted by the UNECE ICoE in Geneva and its operations should be based on extra-budgetary funding;
- e) Organise a y early international conference on PPPs in water and sanitation.

- 1. Outreach and communication- circulate the Centre's work at regional level
- 2. Organise some pilot activities whose results can be shared through the Centre
