

SESSION III: EXPLORING THE SET UP OF A REGIONAL PLATFORM ON GOVERNANCE AND FINANCING FOR THE MEDITERRANEAN WATER SECTOR

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- Funding is needed to pay for water governance and infrastructure expenses
- There is a financial sustainability problem in the region
 - Lebanon may require an additional EUR 400 million/yr and Egypt EUR 1 billion/year.
 - Public budgets of North African countries already 1-3.6% of GDP, ODA provides support but cannot fill gap.
- What is the potential for private sector actors to contribute to the sustainable financing of water and sanitation services?

Water service providers (domestic, international)

 Reduce financial needs through more efficient operators

Attract commercial finance

Sharing of good practices from across the region

Bringing good practices from outside the region (in a cost-effective way)

Involving nontraditional actors in water sector discussions Discussing "difficult" issues in a less politically-charged setting

Developing more credible guidance based on the realities of the region
