

The Water – Migration nexus in rural areas: an important and complex topic

- Migration from rural areas: an important phenomenon and a hot topic, but also
 - a universal and not new adaptation strategy
 - much broader than migration from poorer to richer countries
 - characterized by complex motivations and impacts
- The way we talk about migration has major socio-political impacts
- Nuanced discourses are needed

Critical need for more knowledge and knowledge sharing audience poll at Stockholm Water Week 2019

- Designing water security and rural development interventions that take into account migration
- Likely impacts of climate change at scale and over time
- Gender dimensions of outmigration from rural areas
- Linkages between extreme weather events and out migration
- Stronger global policy frameworks that build more secure futures for migrants
- Impacts of outmigration in shaping rural development in areas of origin
- More context specific knowledge
- Strengthening the mobilisation of capacities of those who have left behind for development in areas of origin
