AIP Goal

To transform and improve the investment outlook for water security and sustainable sanitation for a prosperous, peaceful and equitable society.



AIP Objective

To promote job creation, industrialisation and climate resilient development through gender sensitive investments in water security and sustainable sanitation services



AIP Scope: At least 18 countries in 5 River Basins by 2025

- 6. Gender transformative investments in water security, climate resilient development developed and integrated in national development, disaster risk reduction and COVID-19 economic recovery plans
- 7. Bankable water projects prepared, and finance mobilised at transboundary and national level
- 8. Delivery of critical wat er infrastructure accelerated, addressing the water-health-energy-food-ecosystems nexus and meeting the needs of water dependent growth sectors and the poor
