

DRAFT Session Outline – Latin America and the Caribbean (LAC) Continental Session of the Network Meeting 2020

21 October

16:30 -18:30 pm CEST/Stockholm time

Session summary: This session will bring together the Latin America and Caribbean (LAC) regions to engage each region's Partners on the three (3) anchor areas of GWP's new Strategy, thereby providing an opportunity for dialogue, partner engagement, sharing of opportunities and learning for regional and inter-regional collaboration. The session will focus on partner-to-partner discussions, evolving around the three anchors areas/pillars of GWP's new Strategy: Climate resilience through water, Water Solutions for the SDGs, and Transboundary Water Cooperation. The second part of the session will engage participants around the question: "As water actors, how do you adapt your work to continue bringing change in a COVID-19 context?"

As an interactive experience where partners are invited to contribute their own experiences and perspectives, the session will allow partners within and from different regions to meet one another and share their views, contributing to a stronger sense of being part of "one GWP."
