We are a network of over 80 partners in more than 20 countries, all dedicated to promoting and fostering an **IWRM approach in the Caribbean.**

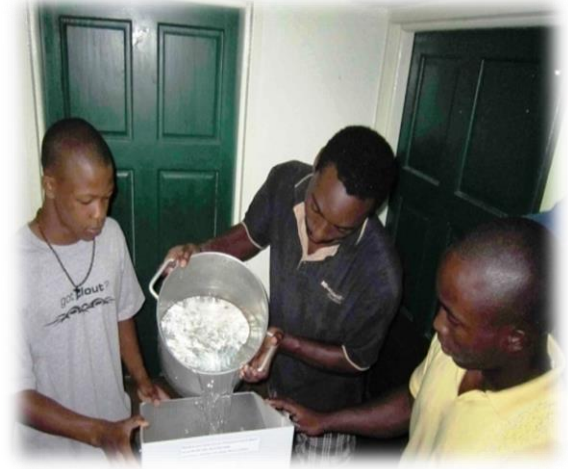

GWP-C facilitates, brokers, partners, builds capacity and exchanges knowledge to support Integrated Water Resources Management (IWRM) in the region.

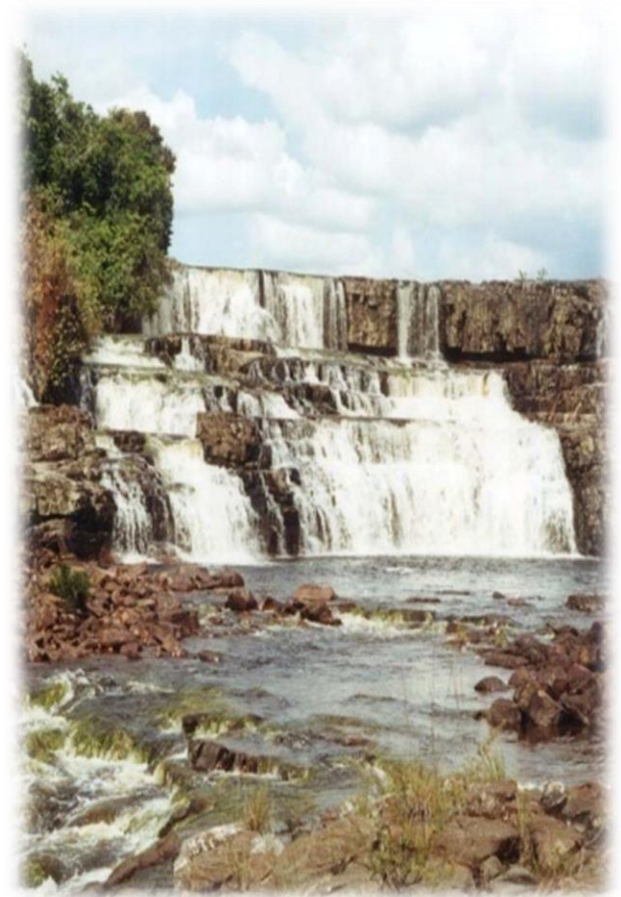

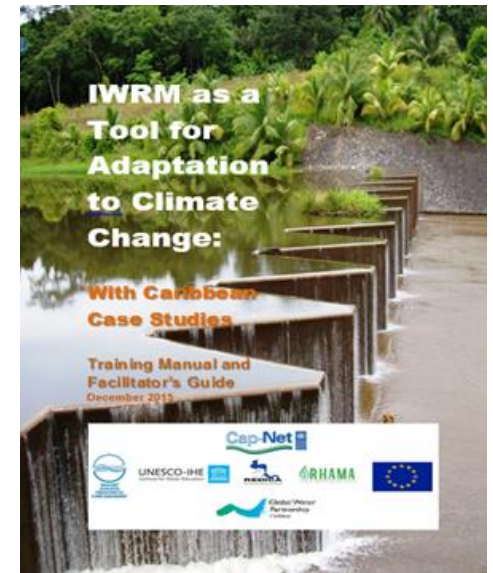
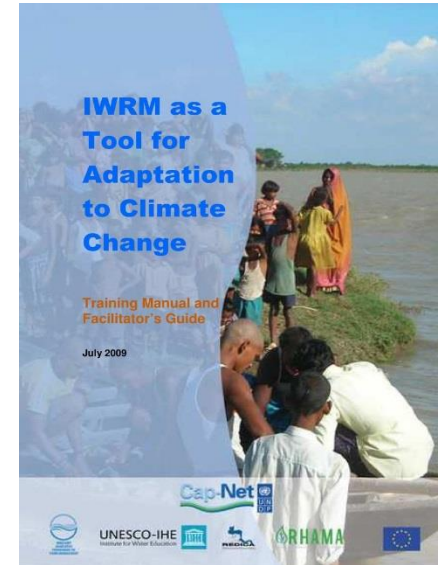
GWP-C Water, Climate and Development Programme (WACDEP)

- **Goal:** To promote water security and climate resilience in Caribbean States as a key part of sustainable regional and national development for economic growth and human security.
- **Executed in Partnership** with the Caribbean Community Climate Change Centre (CCCCC) within the context of the CARICOM Regional Framework for Achieving Development Resilient to Climate Change
- **Overall Objective:** To support adaptation of Caribbean states to climate variability and change through the implementation of better water policies, strategies, programmes and water related adaptation actions
- **Expected Outcome:** To increase the availability of acceptable quantity and quality of water for all beneficial uses and increase the capacity of countries and communities to adapt to climate change and climatic variability in the Caribbean

- GWP-C and Cap-Net are rolling out this updated training package as part of WACDEP Programme

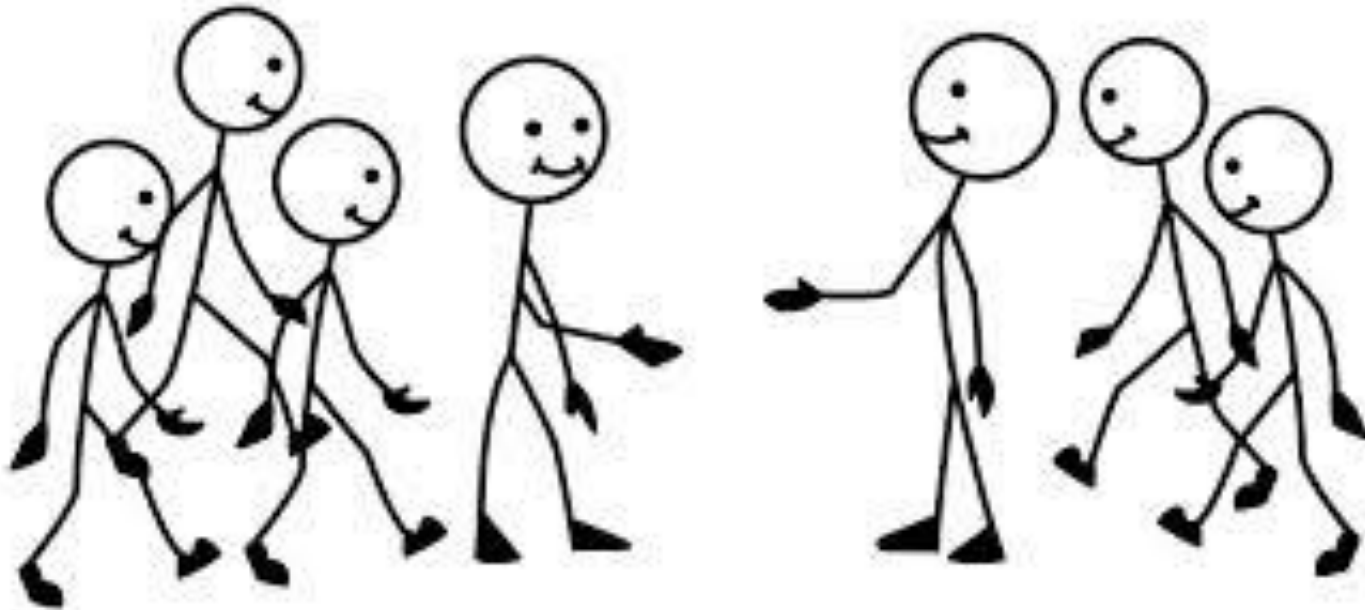

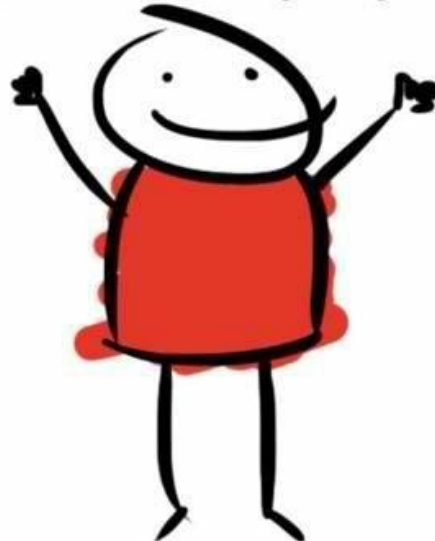
