# **MONTHLY REPORT**

(October 2013)

### Short summary of the programme activities

- 1<sup>st</sup> IDMP CEE Workshop was organized on 15-16 October, Hodrusa Hamre, Slovakia (act. 6.1).
- In November several capacity building trainings / workshop within demonstration projects will be organized (act. 6.2).
- Four demonstration projects have finished with their first milestones state-of-the-arty analysis (5.2, 5.3), overviews of the current status (of small water retention measures, forest sector, agricultural sector, etc.) or set-up of the experiment (act. 5.3).
- Draft version of the questionnaire (act. 1.2) about the current status of development of the Drought Management Plans in the context of WFD in CEE region was prepared.
- CWPs have started with National Consultation Dialogues (act. 2.2).
- Draft version of the 1<sup>st</sup> Policy Brief is prepared (act. 7.2).
- IDMP CEE communication strategy will be discussed at the coordination meeting in Graz (act. 7.2).
- 1<sup>st</sup> IDMP CEE informational brochure is being prepared (act. 7.2).

Final version of the Questionnaire was distributed on 30th October 2013 to the responsible experts from the involved countries (national coordinators) for filling in.

All collected information will be later incorporated into the report which will be an important input for the preparation of the *Guidelines for preparation of Drought Management Plans*. Report will summarize the key stakeholders in each country, current status of the development Drought management plans (DMP), existing indicators for droughts and associated impacts (monitored and evaluated), early warning indicator system and threshold definition, program of measures associated with the DMP, etc.

#### Visit to demonstration project 5.1

As a follow up of IDMP CEE workshop, experimental field of Slovak University of Agriculture in Nitra was visited on 30 October 2013 by GWP CEE Regional Coordinator Mr. Richard Muller. Project leader Prof. Pavol Bielek introduced the machine used for deep sub-soiling and three demonstration fields to test soil water holding capacity. The difference between corns on sub-soiled part of the field can be clearly recognized in the pictures.

In the middle of November they will organize training for project partners. Focus of the training will be on:

- Comparative analysis of different methodologies about climate change scenarios in 2050 (realistic) and 2100 (optimistic, realistic and pessimistic) and approval of more suitable methodology for Activity 5.2
- Discussion of different methods for determination of vulnerability zones of forests ecosystems in 2050 (realistic scenario) and 2100 (optimistic, realistic and pessimistic scenario) De Marton, Holdridge etc., and approval for more suitable method for Activity 5.2
- Data availability and experience for elaboration of forests maps for current climate (1961-1990), realistic scenario in 2050 and optimistic, realistic and pessimistic scenarios in 2100 in Bulgaria,
