



## In Folegandros, water is precious!

Natural water resources here are limited, while demand for water is very high, especially in the summer months.

The 'Zero Drop' water resources protection program saves more than 10 million litres of water annually and supports Folegandros' transformation into a model island with zero water losses.

New seawater boreholes were drilled to supply the island's 5 existing desalination units with more water for treatment.

'Zero Drop' is also empowering the local community with a view to improving water resources management, educating Folegandros's schoolchildren and providing capacity building activities and tools for the hospitality sector.

Aiming to promote innovation in the water sector for areas with limited water availability, 'Zero Drop' is introducing in Folegandros a new pilot technological application, which generates water by using only solar-powered water vapor condensers. Tapping into an unlimited water source, this application converts atmospheric moisture into high-quality drinking water.
