"WEFE NEXUS"

The concept of nexus embodies the idea of integration and facilitates the proper understanding of inter-relationships of water, energy, food and ecosystems and the way in which policies and interventions in these sectors could be promoted in a coherent and coordinated way so that development is sustainable, and biodiversity is protected.






The WEFE Nexus: a world of interdependencies

Water <-> Energy: Water plays a key role in energy production e.g. in hydroelectric plants, for cooling fossil-fuel and nuclear plants, in growing plants for biofuels. At the same time, energy is required to process and distribute water, to treat wastewater, to pump groundwater, to desalinate seawater.

Water <-> Food: Water is the keystone for the entire agrofood supply chain, while agricultural intensification impacts water quality.

Food <-> Energy: Energy is an essential input throughout the entire agro-food supply chain, from pumping to processing to transportation to refrigeration. Conflicts around land use could arise in the case of biofuels or extended solar installations.


Healthy ecosystems are an essential requirement for the sustainability of all the above and are negatively affected if water, energy or food are used in an unsustainable way.

A system of Convergence


Provides equitable « entry points » for the major sectors/components of development




The WEFE Nexus approach in Lebanon

- Use of the nexus approach in ICZM plans and strategies following the sourceto-sea approach that allows:
 - to acknowledge pressures on the coastal area due to upstream causes
 - to identify interlinkages in policy/thematic areas of priority and key crosssectoral actions that produce positive synergistic effects in solving the root causes of degradation
- To enhance sectoral integration resulting in improved design, hence applicability, of related policies
- To link these with investment development







1. Water-energy-food-ecosystems **Nexus**Assessments in priority coastal areas

2. Nexus Inter-ministerial or cross-sectoral
Committees or equivalent bodies established, OR existing inter-ministerial or cross-sectoral bodies steer the development of Nexus Assessments and strategic documents

3. Nexus strategies/Action Plans prepared in priority coastal/transboundary areas

4. Interventions identified and their financing by institutional and/ or private development partners and/ or banks facilitated

Phase I Nexus Assessment report with:
Sectoral characteristics and issues
Inter-sectoral linkages/trade-offs and priorities
Potential solutions and concrete suggestions /
assessment of information gaps.

2nd **Multi-stakeholder consultation event** to validate the findings of the Phase I Nexus Assessment report; prioritize the solutions identified and indicate sources of additional information that may be necessary for the Phase II Nexus Assessment.

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Multi-stakeholders' consultation event 2 will validate the findings of the Phase I Nexus Assessment report; prioritize the solutions identified and indicate sources of additional information that may be necessary for the Phase II Nexus Assessment.

Data collection and/or generation to fill information gaps identified in Phase 1

Development of different scenarios incorporating "business-as-usual" and alternative options to be assessed with the use of modelling tools

Phase II Nexus Assessment, including the outcomes of the analysis.

Multi-stakeholders' consultation event to discuss and evaluate the results, review the recommendations and identify means for the recommendations to be put into practice. We are here
