

> The participants discussed the level of integration of water, energy, land and environment management, including climate variability and change considerations, in terms of designing and implementing regional, national and transboundary policies. They also discussed possible gaps in terms of availability of strategic documents, management tools and processes. They identified what are the actions necessary at the national and transboundary level to foster integration towards the sustainable management of natural resources. A "World Café type interaction" was followed by a plenary discussion.

The "Water, Food, Energy and Environment Nexus in Southeastern Europe" World Café session followed the World Café method, a meeting process that involves a series of simultaneous conversations around the following clusters: Water, Food, Energy and Environment.
